Policies

- Applicants are eligible for up to \$200 per semester (spring, summer, and/or fall) for one completed course and up to \$400 per semester for two completed courses. Applicants must apply each semester.
- Scholarship money may be applied to the cost of the course and materials related to the course (e.g., books, project materials, etc.). Receipts must be submitted to receive reimbursement.
- Applicants should apply for scholarship dollars BEFORE they have completed a course (see deadlines listed below). If you are selected to receive a scholarship, an award letter will be sent to you. Scholarship recipients will receive their scholarship money once the course is completed and final required documents are submitted.
- Applications for each semester are due on the following dates: (There will be no exceptions.) Fall Scholarships-October 15, Spring Scholarships-March 15, Summer Scholarships-July 15.
- To receive scholarship money, applicants must submit a transcript or report card showing course completion and the grade they received. Proof of payment must also be on file. Recipients have up to 45 days after course is completed to submit grades and receipts. After 45 days the scholarship will not be awarded.
- Do not apply for a Summit Apple Tree Fund Scholarship if your course is being paid for by another scholarship source.
- Recipients must receive a B or higher in ECE course work and a C or higher in general course work (exceptions may apply).
- Applicants who are not currently working in an early childhood position; and/or who leave the field to work on a degree, may apply for a Summit Apple Tree Scholarship for an initial semester.
- You may complete this application for a training or conference if the training or conference offers college credit which you intend to complete.
- You must submit a completed affidavit with your application.
